

Frontline Healthcare Providers who have cared for dying patients during the COVID-19 Pandemic

Researchers at the University of Manitoba are conducting a national research study on **the experiences of frontline healthcare providers who have cared for dying patients during the COVID-19 pandemic**. In doing so, this study will explore those experiences, as well as some of the long-term effects that frontline healthcare providers may experience due to the pandemic.
