14 1.0 The Registrar provided an update on the top five priorities identified at the October 22,
15 2022 meeting. Updates on these items will be provided at every Council meeting to show
16 the progress that is being made.

18 2.0 Council went over the recommendations made by the Truth and Reconciliation
19 Commission Ad Hoc Committee. A motion was passed to post an apology on the SCP
20 website which acknowledges the professions past and current harms against Indigenous
21 persons, and pledging to take action going forward.

23 3.0 A motion was passed approving the creation of a fund to support the supervision costs
24 for Indigenous provisional practice psychologists, which would be available to a maximum
25 of ten eligible applicants in the ten years following passing of the motion.

27 4.0 A motion was passed for a request to be submitted to the provincial government for an
28 Indigenous person to be appointed as the third public representative on the Council.

29

30 5.0 The co-chairs and staff liaison of the Professional Conduct Committee joined the meeting
31 to provide a brief update on the work of the PCC. It is Council's intention for these
32 meetings to happen on an annual basis going forward.
