

D. TERMS & CONDITIONS OF THE SCP SUPERVISION SUBSIDY

1. This supervision subsidy program will grant up to \$20,000 to each of a maximum of ten (10) eligible Indigenous provisional psychologists to assist with supervision costs.
2. Applicants must be registered as provisional practicing members of the SCP and have had a Supervision Plan approved by the Registration Committee for each place of employment where they will be completing hours of supervision which may be submitted for reimbursement.
3. If accepted, limited information relating to recipients of this supervision subsidy may be accessed by SCP personnel and other parties (i.e., chartered professional accountants) for disbursement / accounting purposes.
4. Applicants must provide the SCP an **original copy** of a **verified or notarized** Status Card or Métis Nation – Saskatchewan Citizenship Card (or membership in a Métis organization recognized by the Métis Nation – SK) or proof of membership / citizenship in a First Nations / Métis / Inuit community as evidence of their Indigenous status.
5. Applicants who receive funding under this subsidy cannot receive reimbursement for supervision from their employer, band, or any other organization / grant / subsidy, or other source. Approved members of this subsidy must personally pay for their supervision costs in order to claim reimbursement.
6. Reimbursement is provided for eligible supervision costs only; funds will not be provided for study materials / programs related to professional exams (EPPP / oral interview), the cost of taking those exams, professional development courses or materials, or other practice-related expenses outside of supervision by a College-approved supervisor.
7. Payment for supervision will be limited to a maximum of the current recommended hourly rate for professional services, and only applies to supervision provided by a full practice psychologist named as a primary or secondary supervisor on an approved Supervision Plan.
8. Applicants are responsible to submit receipts to the College office from their supervisor(s) on the reimbursement form provided by the College *only* after submission and approval by the Registration Committee of their 750- and 1,500-hour supervised practice, respectively. Hours listed on the College reimbursement form **must** align with hours of supervision recorded in the practice log that is submitted to the Registration Committee for approval.
9. If a provisional member wishes to be reimbursed for supervision hours after their 1,500-hour supervised practice log has been approved, the supervisee and supervisor(s) must maintain a log of ongoing work / supervision hours. **Final reimbursement of these costs will only be considered after the provisional member has passed the oral interview, as confirmed by the Registration Committee. Final receipts must be submitted to the SCP office within 30 days after written confirmation of the successful result of the provisional members' oral interview is received from the Registrar.**
10. If the provisional member is removed from the SCP Register before, or between, any of the legislative standards (i.e., failure of the EPPP three times, failure of the oral interview three times, or failure to obtain full licensure before the expiration of their provisional membership), no further reimbursements will be considered.
11. The applicant is responsible for notifying the SCP of any changes to their employment and/or supervision as soon as possible.

12. The date of official approval for this Indigenous provisional member subsidy program was May 6, 2023. Current provisional Indigenous members may apply for reimbursement from May 6, 2023 forward.
13. Acceptance of applications are reviewed on a “first come first serve” basis. This program is mandated until May 6, 2033.
