Information for Initial Review for SINP

****REVIEW IS NOT A PROMISE OF LICENSURE****

In the province of Saskatchewan, one may not practice as a psychologist, use the title “psychologist” or represent oneself as a psychologist, without licensure with the Saskatchewan College of Psychologists (SCP).

Documents to be submitted as part of the Application Initial Review are listed below. All documentation **MUST** be sent via mail. Once all documents and payment are received, the process for review will take a minimum of 6-8 weeks until you will be notified in regard to a decision.

If you would like a review of your eligibility to apply for licensure to support an immigration application under the Saskatchewan Immigrant Nominee Program (SINP) you must submit to the SCP:

1. An “Application Form for SINP Review”.
2. Review fee (non-refundable) of \$500.00 CDN must be submitted with all application documents. **(payable by Visa, MC, CDN Money Order).**
3. Academic credential must be evaluated through the [ACPRO portal](#) (**credential reviews initiated with the following credential organizations: WES, IQAS, ICES, or CES prior to July 13, 2020 will be accepted until November 1, 2020 after which all evaluations must go through the ACPRO portal link).**

If you are submitting your documentation through the ACPRO portal you must provide – in addition to the documentation provided to the portal site:

- A “Consent for Release of Information” form.
- A “Consent for Release of Information to Gov’t of Sask” form.
- A “Declared Areas of Competence and Interventions” form.
- Current curriculum vitae. (Professional Resume)
- An “Applicant’s Self-Report of MRA Competencies” form.
- Three references provided on the “MRA Competency Reference Form”. Two references must be from Psychologists, the third can be from another licensed professional who knows of your competence and work as a psychologist. (These **MUST** be sent directly from the references to SCP.)
- Copies of letters from Saskatchewan Immigration identifying deadlines to be met.

Until November 1, 2020 ONLY

If you **ARE NOT** submitting your documentation through the ACPRO portal **AS** you applied for the credential evaluation **prior to July 13, 2020** (only accepted until November 1, 2020) you must provide:

1. Documented evidence of practical experience as part of the academic program i.e. practicum and / or internship.
2. Documented evidence of training in professional ethics as part of the academic program.
3. Official transcripts of all post-secondary degrees. Transcripts must clearly state a minimum of a Master's degree in Psychology acceptable to SCP and must show the degree has been granted. Transcripts **MUST** be sent directly from the source.
4. You **MUST** include course syllabi for all courses you wish to have considered for the Foundational Knowledge requirements. (See application form for SINP review).
5. A **verified/notarized*** copy of your Birth Certificate. If you have changed your name, please provide verified copies of all documents (e.g. Marriage Certificate, Certificate of Change of Name, divorce decree).
6. A "Consent for Release of Information" form.
7. A "Consent for Release of Information to Gov't of Sask" form.
8. A criminal record check, including vulnerable sector screening. Original **MUST** be sent.
9. A "Declared Areas of Competence and Interventions" form.
10. Current curriculum vitae. (Professional Resume)
11. An "Applicant's Self-Report of MRA Competencies" form.
12. Three references provided on the "MRA Competency Reference Form". Two references must be from Psychologists, the third can be from another licensed professional who knows of your competence and work as a psychologist. (**These MUST be sent directly from the references to SCP**)
13. Copies of letters from Saskatchewan Immigration identifying deadlines to be met.

* "verified" means a photocopy signed by a chiropractor, judge, magistrate, police officer, lawyer, mayor, physician or dentist, minister, notary public, optometrist, senior administrator in a regional college, technical institute or university, pharmacist, postmaster, principal of a school, accountant, engineer, signing officer or a bank, a veterinarian who can attest that "this is a true copy of the original document".

**If determined to be eligible to apply for licensure with the SCP and if accepted for Immigration, you may make application to the College for licensure. There will be additional requirements that must be met to be eligible for a practice license.
